

Pencil Pleat or Gathered Finish

Ready made pencil pleat curtains can be used with all types of tracks and rails.



- 1 Unpick and securely knot together the draw cords at each end of the heading tape. *[See fig.1]*
- 2 Taking the outside edge of the curtain, hold the tied cords firmly in one hand whilst gently pushing the curtain heading evenly along the cords. *[For best results each curtain should be reduced to approximately half the overall track or rail length]*



- 3 To maintain the pleats, tie the loose cord as closely as possible to the edge of the tape in a loop which can be undone when the curtains need cleaning. Loose cords can be wound neatly out of sight and tucked into the rear of the heading tape. *[See fig.2]* Finally form the gathered heading ruche tape into even pleats along the length of the curtain.



- 4 Divide the rings, gliders or gliderhooks evenly to each side of your rail or track. Insert the curtain hooks evenly along the pocketed tape to correspond with the number of rings or gliders on the rail. *[See fig.3]* There are 3 alternative hook positions in the tape, these will enable you to make slight adjustments to the hanging length of your curtain.

Eyelet Curtains

Eyelet curtains offer a natural pleated look, fit easily on to a pole and require no pulling of heading tapes. Just iron and hang by threading the curtains onto the pole with the finished side of the curtain facing out.
